

GTM RESEARCH RESERVE ANNUAL PARKING PASS



GTM Annual Parking Passes are available for purchase at the GTM Research Reserve Visitor Center located at 505 Guana River Road, Ponte Vedra Beach, FL, 32082.

Cost: \$50 plus 6.5% sales tax

The pass provides access to all GTM recreational areas including: Guana River dam, Guana trailhead, GTM Visitor Center, and North, Middle, and South beach lots. It is accepted only on GTM Research Reserve property and is not valid at state and national parks. Pass admits one vehicle with up to eight passengers and expires one year after the date of purchase. Upon receipt, either adhere the pass to the lower inside of the driver's side windshield, or place in a protective case (such as a transparent CD jewel case) and place on the driver's side windshield. **Lost passes will not be replaced.**

Hours

- The GTM Research Reserve Visitor Center is open Tuesday Saturday, 9:00 am to 4:00 pm, and is closed on state and federal holidays.
- North, Middle and South beach lots and GTM trails are open daily from 8:00 am to sunset.
- Guana River dam is open daily from 4:00 am to 9:00 pm. No overnight use is permitted.

Rules and general information

- All pets must be on a leash no longer than six feet in length. Pet owners must be in full control of their animal(s) at all times, and must pick up and dipose of pet waste in trash receptacle. Leaving pet waste on the trails is prohibited.
- Alcohol is not permitted in any area of the GTM Research Reserve.
- No hunting is permitted within the GTM Research Reserve managed lands.
- Vehicles are only permitted to pass through to the Wildlife Management Area (WMA) on designated hunting weekends as indicated on the FWC Guana River WMA Hunt Map.
- Hunters with proper permits must pass through to the WMA with firearms unloaded and stored away inside their vehicles. Hunters must yield to pedestrians on trails and not exceed posted speed limits.
- Do not litter. This includes cigarette butts and pet waste. Cigarette butts may cause wildfires and pet waste contaminates surrounding waterways.
- Stay on the trails. Use binoculars, spotting scopes and zoom lenses to view wildlife. Do not feed, follow, or approach wildlife.
- Remember that state law protects all plants, animals, and cultural resources on the GTM Research Reserve. This includes archaeological artifacts.
- Respect other visitors and protect the quality of their experience. Move slowly and quietly so as not to disturb wildlife. Yield to other users on the trails.
